

Women who have suffered from sexual abuse can feel as though they are all alone in this world, and nobody understands their struggle.

Our mission is to empower women who have been abused; to give them renewed strength and confidence to live their lives to the fullest.

Hope for Hurting Hearts is a healing educational retreat for those who have been a victim of sexual abuse or domestic violence. It provides a safe place for women to gather amongst other survivors and share their stories and struggles. They learn they are not alone in this world; others are dealing with similar struggles and issues, and there is a loving Savior who wants to make them whole again.

The retreat takes place at Camp Kulaqua, in High Springs, FL, for 3 nights and 4 days. The group size is around 15 women; this ensures a more personal setting and allows counselors to have more one on one time with each survivor. Some activities include special speakers, "Face Your Fears" obstacles for teens, and equestrian therapy.

I was a very happy child enjoying my days playing with my siblings and cousins never thinking about the danger around the corner. One day my uncle's brother asked me to follow him into his bedroom. He always made me laugh and gave me special gifts. But this time he did things to me I couldn't understand. He told me it was our secret and to not tell anyone. When I left the bedroom, I was not the innocent five-year-old anymore. My world had been shattered. Days later my mother asked me why I wasn't playing outside with the other kids. I was so afraid people were going to find out. I started being secretive, and before I knew it, I was angry. Why did he choose me? This was my fault; I shouldn't have entered his room!

When I became a teenager I didn't really care about anything. I saw how dark the world could be. I had an emptiness in my heart. Many days I just wanted to run away, no one understood me. For the longest time, I felt dirty and ashamed.

This past Spring I attended Hope for Hurting Hearts where I met other girls who are survivors of sexual abuse. I learned that the abuse was not my fault, and now I am working on my self-esteem and feelings of shame and insecurities. I am so glad I have a chance to live a normal life.
