Paper Mache Project

Materials Needed:

- Large, Round Balloon
- Newspaper
- Paper Mache Paste
- Cardboard or Thick Cardstock Paper
- Party Streamer or Colored Tissue Paper
- Paper Towels
- Plastic Cups
- Mixing Bowl

- Water
- Flour or Glue
- Salt
- Spray Paint or Acrylic Paint
- Fishing Line or String
- Paper Clip
- Pipe cleaner
- Individually Wrapped Candy

Paper Mache Paste:

Here are a few options for paste for your paper mache projects:

- Mix 1 part flour with about 2 parts of water until you gets a consistency like thick glue. Add more water or flour as necessary. Mix well to get out all the bumps. Add a few tablespoons of salt to help prevent mold!
- Similar to the above recipe Put 4 cups of water into a large pot. Place the pot on the stove and bring the water to a boil. While you are waiting for the water to boil, mix together 1 cup of flour with 2 cups of water, stir well to get out as many bumps as possible. Once the water is boiling, carefully add your flour and water mixture. Simmer this mixture for 2 to 3 minutes, until smooth. Add a few tablespoons of salt to help prevent mold. Allow to cool before you try to use it!
- You can use regular glue mixed with a bit of water. Mix using about 1 part water with 2 parts glue.

Paper Mache Instructions:

Day 1

Begin by ripping several newspapers into long, skinny shreds. Make a paste mixture by using any of the above recipes.

Blow up a large balloon and tie it off. Set the balloon on a bowl or plastic cup that is large enough to keep it steady. Make a loop with the fishing line or string and tie it to the paper clip. (This is how you will hang your piñata later) Tape the paper clip to the top of the balloon.

Put on thin plastic gloves, then begin dipping the newspaper strips into the paste mixture and layering them on the balloon. Brush off excess mixture as the layers are added. This will make cleanup easier.

Let the first layer dry and then add another layer.

Day 2 (depending on drying time)

Design fins and cut them out of a cardboard cardstock paper, or from a recycled manila folder. Test the fit of each fin on the curve of the balloon.

Cut newspaper strips $\frac{1}{2}$ x 3" to 6" long. Dip the newspaper strips in the paper mache paste and attach the fins to the balloon. Start with the tail fin and secure each fin in place. Cover the entire fin with newspaper strips.

Put extra support strips at the base of each fin similar to a hinge to add strength. Use the cup to balance the fish so it doesn't roll into its newly added fins. The fins will be extremely fragile while they are wet.

Allow time for the third layer to dry, then add the fourth, and last, layer of newspaper. Let dry.


Day 3

Once the form has dried, push a pin through the layers and pop the balloon. Cut an opening that's large enough to insert candy and begin dropping treats through the hole. After enough treats are inserted, insert your Jonah and cover the hole with more newspaper and paste.

Decorate the paper mache with party streamers, spray paint, or acrylic paint. (To decorate with streamers, cut small notches into one side of the streamer and glue the streamer into the piñata, one later at a time.)

Jonah inside the big fish:

Draw a "paper person" and cut him out OR twist a pipe cleaner into a person shape, like shown to the right. This is Jonah. Stuff the fish a little ways with candy, and then insert your Jonah into the fish through the opening for the candy. Finish stuffing with candy. The Pathfinders will know Jonah is "trapped" inside their fish.




