HELPS:

- Keys were first used by the Egyptians about 2000 BC, carved from hardwood.
- 2. The early Greeks improved wooden locks and keys.
- 3. The Romans first used metal in their locks and made bronze keys.
- 4. Keys were large, artistically designed -- birds, flowers, horses, etc.
- 5. Linas Yale made Locks and keys in 1818 that were smaller and flatter than the ones being used at the time. His son, Linas Yale, Jr. improved this design and made keys smaller and flatter so they could be easily reproduced and affordable.
