PAINTING AND PRINTING

- 1 Tell about materials for a "stain glass" project.
- 2. Make one "stained glass" project on glass; such as a sun catcher.
- 3. Explain materials for "tole" painting.
- 4. Make one "tole" painting on wood with regular or stencil pattern, any size.
- 5. Explain materials for "textile" (cloth) painting.
- 6. Make one "textile" painting project with a "stamp" and brushed tint or stenciled design.
- 7. Tell about materials for "print" making.
- 8. Make one "print" on paper; such as a greeting card, with a potato, sponge or other "cut plate".
- 9. Draw your own design on any project.
- 10. Tell how you can use these types of decorations.

8. A "cut plate" can be carved on the surface of a potato, cut in half; sponges shaped as hearts, etc. Linoleum can also be carved and used for printing. You can also make a crayon print.
